

Treasurers Report 2022-23

Small Ruminant Chapter ANZCVS

The major activity in the Chapter account over the past year has been the disbursement from the proceeds of the shared Science Week program, a sum of \$1325.33.

FAMACHA card trading organised by President Sandra has slowed, raising an income of \$796.60 for 26 cards; noting that last year sales raised \$2442.78. Postage cost of has risen to \$95.60, mainly because all but one card was sold as a single unit to individuals. Last year University of Melbourne took a tranche.

Subscriptions rose by \$60 to \$460 this year, on the back of the large number of successful examination candidates in 2021.

Thanks to the support of Mary Anne Hiscott in the office over the year in dealing with the FAMACHA transactions. Both President Sandra and I have again seen occasional attempts to scam monies out of the chapter, which were happily ignored, but noted!

The reduced FAMACHA activity and the biannual exam development cost (this year \$312.60) has been offset by that Science Week activity, so the Chapter's balance has risen significantly, to a healthy \$8690.20. Sandra reports having 37 FAMACHA cards still in stock; perhaps at some point this year we may have consider the purchase of more, which will be of the order of \$2000AUS.
